Tommaso Sandri

His research elements and emphasis on food culture as a dialogue and a space for sharing are inspiring for our goal of positioning food at the center of our exhibition. Additionally, his methodology of incorporating participatory aspects of food culture is a relevant factor in our overall vision.

Proposals were assessed on a 1-5 scale for each criterion, where 1 indicated low alignment and 5 represented exceptional execution. The criteria included:

- 1. **Creativity and Originality**: Evaluated the innovation and unique approach to the themes of the call ("Forums, Forms, Food") and the concept of "borderlessness."
- 2. **Contextual Relevance**: Measured how effectively the proposals engaged with the historical, cultural, and environmental context of Nova Gorica and Gorizia, exploring the symbolic meaning of the border.
- 3. **Authenticity and Depth**: Assessed the sincerity and depth of the concepts, distinguishing between genuine inquiry and superficial engagement.
- 4. **Community Engagement**: Examined the proposals' potential to involve and create dialogue with the local population, respecting their lived experiences.
- 5. **Sustainability**: Considered awareness of environmental impact, material usage, and waste reduction in the exhibition-making process.

- 6. **Intergenerational and International Appeal**: Rated accessibility and appeal across age groups and international audiences, fostering diverse perspectives.
- 7. **Alignment with GO!2025 Biennial Goals**: Assessed how well the proposals embodied the biennial's vision of connection through "forums, forms, and food" in a collaborative, inclusive manner.
- 8. **Long-term Impact**: Evaluated the potential for lasting insights, future reflections, and sustained community connections inspired by the proposals.
- 9. **Risk-taking and Experimentation**: Measured boldness and willingness to challenge norms through creative and unconventional approaches.
